Okay, so in terms of this NOFO.

8 Tarra McFadden

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So it's for the continuum of care program and issued by the US Department of Housing and Urban development. And nationally, there's \$3.918 billion available. It's several different federal funding sources.

That had available that they're making available under the NOFO. The entire community application package, and we'll talk a little bit more about what that means, is due 14 January at 08:00 P.M. eastern. So that's really my deadline, my team's deadline.

That's not something you should worry about, but the things that we all need to do together are between now and then.

In terms of what's available for our local funding amount, there's a couple of HUD uses. This will surprise NO one, some technical terms and some formulas to figure out how much each community is eligible to apply for. So the 1st.

Is the annual renewal demand, and that is \$11 million, and that funding it represents how much it would take if how much it would take to fund our community, if everything that we funded in the last application.

Was funded again for an additional year. So that's a funding threshold that the ranking committee needs to be aware of as we put together our application, but also US project applicants should be aware of.

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Just to get a sense of of what funding is available. Then HUD applies this rule of four communities where, we are required to put our applications into kind of buckets, tier one and tier two. And tier one.

15 Tarra McFadden

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Is, is generally safer, less competitive because as long as we meet threshold and and score ok, we, our community will receive that 30 %.

And, and then the tier two funding is competitive on a national level. So how well we do as a community, how well the project application itself scores will determine whether we get additional funding in tier two.

That funding line between tier one and tier two used to be about 90 % or higher. This year, their one of their priorities is to increase the competition related to these COC funds.

And so our tier one funding is only 30 % of our annual renewal demand. So we have a much lower amount of kind of guaranteed funding, and so we need to be strategic about how we access those dollars or or what we put forward.

For those dollars. There is also bonus funding and DV bonus funding available. In, in this competition there's not that it's just additional dollars for new projects for DV bonus.

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They need to be dedicated to serving survivors of domestic violence, but there aren't other restrictions in those pots. So all told our community could win, could gather \$14.2 million if we were performing well and and able to get absolutely everything.

Some of the kind of high level policy priorities that Todd has outlined in the NOFO relate very closely to the executive order that was issued in July about ending the crisis of homelessness in our streets. So that's priority one. Prioritizing treatment and recovery, advancing public safety, promoting self sufficiency for the clients that may receive.

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Support through these programs, improving outcomes and minimizing trauma. So hopefully you will see what we are looking for in terms of applications are things that align with these priorities because that's what will help us score well with with HUD and we'll increase our chances of of getting that funding, that competitive funding.

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One thing to note about the the nature of this application, it's a little bit different than, an application where you receive funds directly from Salt Lake county or salt lake city or the state. Through this process Salt Lake County.

Is what's designated as the collaborative applicants and with the coalition, we work on the collaborative application. So it's our community's response to ending homelessness, how we're doing on system performance, what types of housing do we have available? What services do we have available?

Well, what are the outcomes for those programs kind of generally as an entire system. And then we also have the project applicants. So individual agencies or organizations that are applying for funds for specific housing or service projects, and then all of that kind of gets bundled together.

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And forwarded to HUD in what's known as the consolidated application and then HUD evaluates those, those applications and funds accordingly. So again, the more we.

27 Tarra McFadden

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The better we perform as a community increases the likelihood of more of our projects being funded. We have our ranking committee that will review the applications to and then they determine a list of applications and priority order.

28 Tarra McFadden

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To submit to HUD, then HUD will also review applications and they make final funding decisions and will also be, will directly grant the funds to the project applicants. So.

29 Tarra McFadden

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Salt Lake County in this instance, we kind of act as a middle person to coordinate things, but we do not have a direct grantee relationship for these dollars. I saw a question I'll answer here about the ranking committee.

30 Tarra McFadden

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So we have requirements in our, the regulations that govern the COC program to coordinate with ESG funders and so we try to have an ESG funder on our review committee.

3Tarra McFadden

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Typically somebody that is well versed in dealing with youth or veterans or victims of domestic violence. And so just kind of subject matter experts.

Everybody on the committee has to declare any conflicts of interest and if they, they can't be from an agency that's currently receiving funds. So we, we try to make that clear. We typically don't release the names of.

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Those involved until after the the scoring is complete just so that we don't have agencies approaching them directly, everything should come through me. And our ranking policies and procedures kind of the processes that that we do to to make those decisions are part of the competition guide, which is kind of the application packet available on our website.

A few changes to note, especially those of you that have participated in, in the COC funding process before. Like I mentioned, only 30 % of funding is protected in tier one that's down from 90 % in past years. An additional limitation for these dollars is that only 30.

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Percent of what we are eligible to apply for. It's about \$3.3 million can be used for permanent housing. So this is a a dramatic shift from we've typically used about 80 % of our funding to fund permanent support of housing and rapid rehousing, which is also considered permanent housing.

36 Tarra McFadden

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This year we will only be able to put up to \$3 million, forward for those types of projects. All projects that are applying must compete together. In the past they've had kind of.

37 Tarra McFadden

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A little bit different process for DV projects, bonus projects, and for YHDP projects, that's our youth homelessness demonstration program. We do not have any eligible YHDP projects that are up for renewal this year.

38 Tarra McFadden

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But we will have some next year and expect this process to be similar moving forward, so we wanted to flag that as a, as a change. There are certain prohibitions that can disqualify a project. We'll talk about that.

Deeper into the presentation had new national priorities on treatment recovery and required services. The federal government is moving away from a housing 1st, which ensures that.

40 Tarra McFadden

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Services are offered and, and available to all but are not a condition of occupancy or continued program participation to a model that really encourages, well, and that requires service participation for.

41 Tarra McFadden

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For the agencies and for the clients receiving services. How to also elevates public safety as a major scoring factor, so asking questions about not only do our, do our programs work and coordinate with public safety entities in the community, but how as a.

42 Tarra McFadden

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How as the Sally Valley Coalition to end homelessness, how does our community response to homelessness involve those in law enforcement and other related public safety? Because of the required services, expanded requirements kind of reshape what we have typically been familiar with our transitional housing, rapid rehousing permanent supportive housing and outreach programs.

43 Tarra McFadden

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So new transitional housing must show must provide 40 h a week of s supportive services and there's there's technical.

44 Tarra McFadden

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I don't ok so 40 h of services is the ideal. There are some exceptions to that. Then permanent support of housing and should be focused on serving elderly and physically disabled individuals, so substance use disorder under this NOFO no longer includes.

45 Tarra McFadden

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Or qualifies as a disabling condition. Street outreach needs to have demonstrate strong partnerships with law enforcement and rapid rehousing must show strong employment outcomes and also require services.

46 Tarra McFadden

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The merit review replaces previous scoring. So HUD has always kind of looked at at the community process and.

47 Tarra McFadden

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So we will be evaluated on what our application process looks like and then also our system performance and coordination engagement. So what does our governance structure look like? Who else in the community are we working with outside of homeless service providers?

48 Tarra McFadden

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What's our plan for improving performance? The tier two scoring changes, so tier two will now projects that that end up in that bucket will receive additional points or or.

49 Tarra McFadden

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Improve their chances of getting funding if they require services, and then the expanded risk review. So HUD has typically looked at applications made sure that.

50 Tarra McFadden

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Agencies didn't have outstanding monitoring findings with HUD or other federal offices. They've now included that too or expanded that to include the expected general and government accountability office findings.

Public complaints, so they're able to search for new stories or, information available about how an agency may or may not be performing.

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And also, they're evaluating the, the organization's history of subsidizing activities that conflict with the NOFO. So not only looking forward at what does this application do, how are people committed to the priorities that hubs put forward?

53 Tarra McFadden

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But also what have these agencies and projects done in the past and they are able to then use that as grounds for denying funding. So it's a much more subjective review than it has been in the past which is something to be aware of moving forward.

54 Tarra McFadden

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Our process timeline, so there are deadlines within the NOFO that are established that we as a local community have to commit to, so apologies that it's a crazy timeline, apologies, but it's over the holidays as it's falling. But, but this is kind of what we have. So.

55 Tarra McFadden

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Our timeline for apple project applications will be due next Friday. Then we have to have our ranking committee process completed NO less than 15 days before the final submission date.

56 Tarra McFadden

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So that's going to line up to 30 December. We hope to finish that process earlier, so that we aren't conflicting with the holidays and also so that agencies have time to make any corrections necessary.

57 Tarra McFadden

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But at this point we're kind of playing it by ear. But, but 30 December would be the absolute latest that you would find out whether or not your application will be moved forward for funding. And then the full application, again, that's kind of my deadline or my team's deadline is 14 January 2020.

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Six when everything will go in together. And then Hud has said that they will make announcements by March, I believe, and then contracts would follow after that.

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Maybe I'll stop there for questions if anybody has any.

So I think I answered the who sits on the ranking committee and then is there a funding cap for programs? No, it's just kind of our overall funding cap, and then the bonus for new projects, it's just additional funding that's available to our community for new projects and the rules are essentially the same as the.

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A regular new project application and the ranking committee will determine whether somebody is going to be funded with bonus dollars or with regular dollars and I appreciate your question Zach. Do face palm and sad emojis count.

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Yeah, I, and I'm sorry Terry I joined late, so if this was already a question, I can catch up with my team. But for the eligibility criteria changes to PSH, has HUD issued anything about the expectations for existing participants on the program?

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So if, if being, if the like age threshold and physical disability is the only criteria, if we had determined someone eligible from like a mental health status, are they only able to stay on the program through the extent of our current contract?

65 Tarra McFadden

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Does that make sense? They have not Yes. They have not put any guidance related to that out yet. I would hope that it's forthcoming, it's worth sending in a question, and will be kind of our process as we transition to these new.

66 Tarra McFadden

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Programs, because each application as it's awarded is subject to the rules that were in the NOFO. My guess is that those clients will be fine until the new funding starts.

67 Tarra McFadden

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And then whether they grandfather folks that are already in the program in or they expect a shift in participants in the program will have to determine that or hope that they provide guidance around that, but good question.

68 Tarra McFadden

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And then Laurie had a possible to have help evaluating whether or not a program would be a good fit prior to filling out a full application. Yes, we'll have some time to talk about that as a group, but also I am available for like one on one chats. I know it's the timing's crazy, but so I'll try to make myself as available as possible.

69 Tarra McFadden

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And so with my team talk about how we think your project would fit in the larger application process.

70 Tarra McFadden

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Okay, so allowable project types, so for.

71 Tarra McFadden

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For new projects, folks are able to apply for supportive services only and that can be a standalone project or an outreach project. The distinction with a.

72 Tarra McFadden

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Supportive services only is typically that it's not tied to a specific housing project, so it can be it's should be, services.

73 Tarra McFadden

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And supports four clients helping them get into housing and improve outcomes, improve employment, improve income, all of those things, but it's not necessarily tied to a specific housing project or.

74 Tarra McFadden

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The, the grantee needs to not also be providing rental assistance to that client. So and that's a technical thing that we can get into. And then outreach is what it sounds like. Transitional housing HMIS.

75 Tarra McFadden

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We currently have designated the state of Utah as our HMIS provider, and so they are the ones that are eligible to apply for that funding for coordinated entry, it's kind of a similar situation where we have Salt Lake County designated as the coordinated entry group.

76 Tarra McFadden

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So they're the only ones eligible to apply for that. Both of them would be eligible to apply for expansion, but I don't believe have any plans to do so. A reminder again of that NO more than 30 % of our \$3.3 million.

77 Tarra McFadden

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Will be eligible for permanent sort of housing and rapid rehousing. We have existing programs that are working on kind of retooling trying to fit into that amount, and so it's likely that.

78 Tarra McFadden

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That those projects will be prioritized because they're already housing folks right now over new projects. So if you're looking at a new project, those are eligible, new PSH, new rapid rehousing with these new guidelines.

But, NO that support of services only transitional housing are kind of what we're looking for in terms of new effort under this opportunity. And then transition grants only apply to those that are renewing and it'll, it's a technical process that allows renewal grants to change their components.

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So if they are currently a rapid rehousing project, they could apply for a transition grant to turn that project.

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Into a transitional housing project and it just gives the project a little bit more time to transition rather than turning off one project one day and turning it on the next day.

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The project review criteria, we've put some of this in our local review process, but these are things that HUD will be looking for making sure that the agency and the program does not have any racial preferences or prohibited activities that includes referring to gender as anything other than a biological binary.

So, be careful about that language in your policies and procedures could be a flag for HUD. Cost reasonableness and mainstream leverage. They want to make sure that they're not the only ones paying for the program, that there are other connections to fund the program.

Transitional housing has that 40 h a week service requirement. It's exempt for participants that are 62 or older or with a physical disability or impairment, and also it can be reduced proportionately so if you've got a client that's working.

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15 h a week, then you would just be providing an additional 25 h worth of services. Outreach must partner with law enforcement. PSH must serve elderly and physically disabled, that's a narrower definition than we are used to for these programs, and then the strong employment outcomes.

86 Tarra McFadden

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For the project risk and review, we'll be looking at financial controls, effective management systems results of audits, and then again kind of other public sources, history of subsidizing or facilitating activities that conflict with purposes of this NO po. Those are things Hud will be looking for. And then for.

87 Tarra McFadden

The community application, those things I previously mentioned, making sure that service participation requirements are integrated into our local ranking, evaluation of treatment and recovery capacity for the community strength of supportive service funding.

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Hub clever. So opportunity zones are like their designations by the federal government, I think they they exist beyond HUD, that the federal government is encouraging.

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That is part of the application process just on it'll be on the smart sheet form asking whether those you're operating in an opportunity zone, and then verification of immigration status.

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So, this is asking that all nonprofit COC projects verify immigration status via save, which is a federal database before providing benefits and ensuring eligibility and compliance with.

96 Tarra McFadden

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This code section. I as far as I understand, the housing authorities are already doing this, but we need to demonstrate that also our nonprofit partners are engaging in this.

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Moving forward, as applicants for project funding, we will only require that you submit the local applications at this stage. Hopefully will be available soon and we will determine a deadline for that piece.

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But we want to make sure that you have time to dedicate to the application and if it's not there, we don't have wiggle room to move our deadline, and so we'll limit it to just the local application.

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So just the forms available on our website for now and then additional information will come. Hud will need to make the forms available. We will try to provide some training as well and technical assistance around navigating that system.

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If you aren't already registered for it, it's probably a good idea to make sure that you have access to the system or to establish an account in the system and the website that's linked on this slide.

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Has navigation guides related to that. So you'll be able to at least get set up in the system and then as soon as the application materials are open and available from hub, we'll let folks know and give a new deadline for that component of the application. Any questions there?
